Education

There is no minimum competency level requirement to work in the American insurance industry. However, The Institutes were established to provide risk management and insurance education. Its qualifications are highly regarded by employers in the market. The Institutes' programmes and exams can be taken online from anywhere in the world. To improve their job prospects, Irish students who intend to travel to America to secure employment in the insurance/risk management market are advised to undertake studies with The Institutes, prior to seeking employment.



CPCU ®

The CPCU designation is the premier designation for those building a career in property/casualty insurance in America. This customisable programme consists of 4 core courses (modules) providing a foundation in property and casualty insurance. The remaining 5 courses are made up of 3 concentration courses, 1 elective course, chosen from a range of course options, and finally, an online course in ethics. These choices allow the CPCU to be tailored to personal or commercial lines insurance.

Holders of the CIP qualification from the Insurance Institute of Ireland are eligible for an exemption from a CPCU elective.

Holders of the MDI qualification from the Insurance Institute of Ireland are eligible for an exemption from CPCU 500 (core course).
